Appeal from El Presidente - Cross Country

The new format of the Club Championships seems to have proved popular as can be seen by the numbers of club members running the Road and Fell counters, but now we come to the Cross Country season. In the last 15 years the highest number of male counters was in 1992 when we had 74 finishers.

According to Harry Manning's records, our highest number of finishers ever, has been 98 at Burnley and Blackburn in 1985 and 99 at Blackburn in 1986.

Now I realise that Cross Country can be hard, perhaps not as hard in some ways as a tough 'A' race as Ian Greenwood mentioned recently, but Mark Nutter always tells me they are too hard and as you may well know, Mark runs more than a few fell races each year. Our Road Running fraternity may worry about the difficult terrain, although they should be able to cope with the speed.

I believe that Cross Country is the perfect meeting point for our Road and Fell runners, as it is a good balance between the two disciplines. It has speed and strength, with varying underfoot conditions. Of the chosen venues, Towneley, in my opinion, will be the best venue for us to try to equal, or better, our record turnout, as there are no big hills for the Road Runners (as at Blackburn) and it is as wide a course as you will find. For the Fell Runners there are some slopes and possibly a little mud, certainly enough to test your strength/speed, although sadly no stiles where you usually have a rest.

Therefore could I appeal to all our members to turn up at Towneley on 10th November and see if we can achieve a record. Come on all you hard Fell Runners and fast Road Men! Miss out on shopping, DIY, or watching television and run at Towneley, 10th November.

LETTER

So now we know!

At the Club AGM it was revealed that we are members of a secret society – a society so secret that members will learn, only by chance, of decisions made by its committee and will not be made aware of the reasons for those decisions. PENDLETON FELL RACE

Those of you who attended the prize-giving after the recent Pendleton Fell Race will have heard me announce that next year will be the 25th time I and my family have organised the race. I have been persuaded by my family that it would then be an appropriate time to call it a day and give someone else a chance.

Pendleton is one of the oldest races in the FRA calendar, Bill Smith notes in his excellent book "Stud Marks on the Summits" of races taking place from the village back in the 1920s. Clayton took over the organising of the race 51 years ago when one of the early organisers was the late Gerry Charnley, well remembered by older Clayton members. He was to die in a tragic accident on Striding Edge years later. John Haworth did the job for a few years, before handing over to George Brass. It was George who changed the course to its present 5 miles 1500' ascent in order for it to qualify as a championship course. Although we have never used it as such it would be eminently suitable, especially if a field could be hired for car parking.

Over the years the race has attracted most of the top fell runners. It provided a young Ron Hill with his first fell race win back in 1958. When I took over as organiser I inherited a folder with all the results from 1969. These make interesting reading. For instance, in that year there were just fifteen runners, all appearing to be Clayton members with Paul Livesey up front. The following year saw the field double in size and Alan Heaton knocking three minutes off the time. A young Jeff Norman could only finish fourth. By 1972, race numbers had increased to 54 with Dave Cannon having a comprehensive win. Jack McGuire was still a Junior, and Harry Manning was just ahead of Stan Bradshaw. By the following year Harry had improved to finish in the top half of the field.

By 1976 the numbers had increased to 126 which included the first lady runner, Anne-Marie Grindley. Noteworthy also is that in these days when 50% of the first ten can be veterans, indeed this year Mike Wallace V50 finished second, in 1976 the first V40 could manage no better than 36th position. How times change.

In the early days and right up to the 1980s, the race was run in conjunction with the village sports. Many a Clayton member would run the fell race then compete in the flat races. Don Talbot remembers well the first time won the 100 yards beating Ron Hill. The small cup he won is one of his proudest possessions.

Over the years, the race has attracted many top track and fell international runners, the likes of John Calvert, Dave Cannon, Ricky Wilde, Ian Roberts, Harry Walker, have all enjoyed victories. Then in 1983 along came Kevin Capper an international steeplechaser from Lancaster who in winning set a time of 30.38 unbeaten to this day. The following year the ladies record was set by Carol Haigh at 36.36, a time which few men are able to better these days, even though the course has never altered over the years.

During the running boom of the 1980s we attracted some very large fields. I note that in 1987 we had a field of 257. I have always tried to keep the entry fee low, nevertheless we have usually made a profit and over the years have been able to donate over £1300 to such worthy causes as the Scanner Appeal and Air Ambulance, along with many others.

Throughout the time I have organised the race I have been blessed by unstinted help from Clayton members past and present. This year's helpers, some a bit long in the tooth, I especially thank: Alistair Patten, Don Talbot, Bill Smith, Cameron Choyce, Gerald Rawlinson, Peter Barlow and Dave Mashiter.

And so, with such a history it would be a sham if the race were not to continue after next year as a Clayton organised event. I hope that someone will come forward during the next 12 months so that whilst I will organise next year's race they could be introduced to various contacts and see how things are done.

NINE EDGES ENDURANCE EVENT

(This event was originally due to be held on the 6 October and I'd intended to do a short advance piece on it in this month's newsletter. In the end, it was run on the 15 September, but the pictures are nice so I've kept the piece in! I especially liked the idea of having the option of doing a climb on each of the Edges. If any Clayton members took part in the race (running or climbing), I'd welcome a report. This article will not be in the paper copy of the newsletter due to lack of space. Ed.)

Hike, Run or Climb!

This event was held on Saturday 15th September 2007. It was a 20 mile off road event for walkers, runners and climbers to help raise money for a new base for Edale Mountain Rescue Team. It is over some rough moorland and along gritstone edges, and some navigational ability is required. There is about 600 metres of height gain. The route is on the OS Dark and White Peak Maps.

Route

The event starts at Fairholmes Car Parks, grid reference SK173894. Walkers and climbers are free to start at any time between 7.30am and 9.30 am. Runners start at 10am. Registration will be open from 7.15am until 10am.

The route follows the 9 gritstone edges: namely, Derwent Edge, Stanage, Burbage North, Burbage South, Froggatt, Curbar, Baslow Edge, Gardoms and Birchens. There will be marshals at various compulsory checkpoints along the route. A suggested route map with the exact checkpoint locations will be on display at the start of the event. However the following information is given as an indication:

All participants (whether hikers, runners or climbers) follow the same route. The route is not marked and the choice of route between the checkpoints is down to individual choice. Please use marked public footpaths and bridleways and comply with the country code at all times. All hikers and runners must walk or run directly above or below each of the 9 Edges. Large detours are not permitted. Additionally climbers must climb one route of their choice on each of the nine Edges, at their own risk. If more than one route on any of the Edges is climbed, climbers may be disqualified due to time constraints.

The route finishes at the Robin Hood pub, near Baslow. Please ensure you come to the finish desk as soon as you arrive.

This event is intended as a personal test of endurance, particularly for walkers and climbers. However the event is also a fell race and so prize winners (runners only) will be announced at the Robin Hood pub that afternoon.
